- (5) The right to post and update the Article on e-print servers as long as files prepared and/or formatted by JLPS or its vendors are not used for that purpose. Any such posting made or updated after acceptance of the Article for publication shall include a link to the online abstract in the journal or to the entry page of the journal.
- (6) The right to prepare derivative publications based on the Paper, including books or book chapters, journal papers, and magazine articles, provided that publication of a derivative work occurs subsequent to the official date of publication of the JLPS publication in which the Paper appears.
